Jean Shepherd DOCTOR OF HUMANE LETTERS

Jean Shepherd is the Hoosier humorist, author, and performer whose tale of a young boy's burning desire for a Red Ryder BB gun brought smiles to the faces of all who saw the 1983 film A Christmas Story. With his radio and television shows, books, magazine columns, and films, this "multimedia phenomenon" entertains with a distinctly Midwestern viewpoint that gently highlights the foibles and strengths of the human spirit.

Compared to such luminaries as Mark Twain and Will Rogers, Shepherd has followed in their traditions of witty commentary on American life, based loosely on his own childhood rites of passage in the Calumet Region of northwest Indiana. By centering his tales on the adventures of the character Ralph Parker in the mythical town of Hohman, Indiana, Shepherd has brought what he terms "Industrial Town America" to life. Hohman is, in fact, one of the main thoroughfares in Hammond.

Born July 26, 1929, in Chicago, Jean Shepherd grew up in Hammond, where he attended elementary and secondary school. He worked as a mail boy in a steel mill as a young man. At the age of 16 he began his radio career in Hammond as a sportscaster. He served in the United States Army Signal Corps during World War II, installing radar equipment. He returned to his native soil to study engineering and psychology at the Indiana University Calumet Center in 1949 and 1950.

In the 1950s Shepherd took a variety of radio positions, moving from WLW in Cincinnati to KYW in Philadelphia. He eventually settled in New York City, working as a raconteur for WOR from 1958 to 1976. He matured as an actor and comedian, spinning tales that were full of adolescent braggadocio, hyperbole, and ironic voices. In the 1960s, he began turning his stories into books. The popular Wanda Hickey's Night of Golden Memories and Other Disasters (1971) included the tale of a prom date gone wildly awry. He also created the PBS travelogue Jean Shepherd's America (1969-72), in which he and a camera crew drove from Florida to Alaska.

Shepherd has found many voices for his humor. He has performed at New York's Carnegie Hall and on Broadway. His works have been published in magazines as diverse as *Playboy* and *Car and Driver*. His films have been shown both on television and in theaters.

His talents have been internationally recognized. Shepherd's many awards and honors include the Mark Twain Award, given by the International Platform Speakers Association. His first book, *The America of George Ade* (1961), a collection of Ade's works that Shepherd edited, was nominated for the National Book Award. The film *A Christmas Story* was given the Genie Award for Best Comedy, Canada's equivalent of the Oscar.

Perhaps Shepherd's most valuable talent is his ability to appeal to everyone, young and old. His tales examine the experiences common to most twentieth-century Americans. To read a Shepherd narrative is to find oneself within the pages. For northwest Indiana, in particular, he is a diplomat whose artistic work has made a small region of the United States come alive for audiences throughout the world.
